Greetings everyone

I have found this year to be exceptional in the extreme. By June we had exceeded the average rainfall for a whole year. In 47 years of living in Havelock North I have not experienced anything quite like it. I have one crop however that has been magnificent in its growth. This I believe is called "weeds". It is a battle royal to keep them in check.

At our last meeting I gave a presentation on Climate Change and mentioned that warming sea levels would affect the warming of the oceans and ocean currents as well as environmental effects on sea life. However I never envisaged how quickly this would affect the climate. North America, Asia and Europe are experiencing widespread record temperatures, wild fires, and flooding. Today as I write this, thousands of tourists are being evacuated from the Islands of Rhodes and Corfu in the Mediterranean. In Canada New Zealand fire fighters are still helping to fight forest fires that have been burning for weeks. The reason is that the **El Niño** effect is now causing this. (I have a 20 second video to show you).

Because we are a geologically young country the unconsolidated sediments on our hillsides are so saturated that they are losing cohesion with underlying bedrock and sliding off it. Housing developments with the remodelling of gullies and streams to quickly remove groundwater must be an important planning procedure. Interestingly my Climate Change presentation has now been given to Rotary and SeniorNet Taradale.

Some Good news. Our advertising and promotions have produced an increase in membership and our association with SeniorNet is benefiting both organisations. I have now visited the four major retirement villages and we now have liaison members there to promote and help their members to join U3A and SeniorNet. Working with retirement villages is something we should encourage for that will promote our endeavours. With SeniorNet, I approached "Summerset in the Vines" and I gave a presentation to the village on "Hacking, phishing and Scams". This showed how to avoid the dangerous emails and scams now prevalent, and how to create secure passwords. It was well received and we gained membership there as a result.

Finally it was very interesting and exciting to see the arc of beach fires burning the driftwood and slash all along the Napier coast celebrating Matariki. All that was needed was more fireworks in the winter month. It should be an annual event instead of Guy Fawkes.

He was elected as a Hastings District Councillor in 2022, and has representations in heritage organisations and finance functions. He lives in Havelock North with wife Raewyn and dog Bella.

Some notes from Norris made for his Geology Group on the formation of New Zealand.

Zealandia is composed of a large submerged land mass, part of which is New Zealand that rises above sea level. The Geological Society of America has published a paper saying that "Zealandia" is actually Earth's Hidden Continent. I have created a large presentation (Like



my Climate Change topic) for the Geology group. This is the story of how New Zealand was formed by breaking away from ancient Australia, when dinosaurs roamed (as discovered by Joan Wiffen). The formation of the Tasman Sea and for millions of years how NZ was a few islands in a tropical sea. How NZ developed with an ecosystem based on Birds and not mammals. How Coal deposits formed and how our limestone countryside was created. Then the coming of volcanoes and a huge Alpine rift and how we are now dangerously trapped between two colliding continental plates producing earthquakes and faults which will continue.

Computer group – with Norris Kenwright and Margaret Buckley

This year Margaret and I started with 17 members; we lost three and gained three so we are now "Even Stevens". We have sent out 50 written tutorials on aspects of windows 10 and explained them on the big screen at the Havelock North Club. It is surprising how Microsoft hides many good features that make computing more interesting and how old

versions of programs can often produce better results that newly promoted "Apps". Also Microsoft tries to direct you to its own programs when there are far better ones produced by experts on the internet. We show our members how to download them safely and how to avoid downloading scams. One important part of our work is to demonstrate OneDrive and Google Drive where you can back up all your precious files and folders in the Cloud. Then they are never lost so that you can always download them to a new device if your computer fails.
