Cycle Group to be run by Bruce Allen



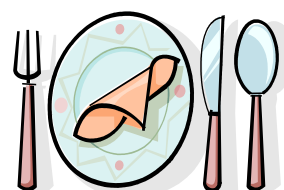
Do you like to cycle for fun and fitness? Would you like to join a U3A Havelock North cycle group to explore our excellent cycle tracks and pathways?
